TRAINING OVERVIEW

The Summer Training Seminar for Social Science Teachers aims to proactively contribute to the enhancement of the life of Filipinos by reaching out to the academic and teaching community. It encourages academic citizenship that is collegial and informed, instills a sense of professionalism, provides participants with the best pedagogical and disciplinary practices in their respective academic communities, and creates constructive engagement among social science teachers. This annual extramural program aspires to promote a cosmopolitan mind-set, combine the values for depth of knowledge and disciplinary specialization, and improve confidence-building and capacity-building of secondary education nationwide.

The extramural summer training, as the main extension activity of the college, seeks to:

- enhance understanding of current concepts, perspectives, and methodologies in the different social science disciplines;
- help improve the social science and philosophy content of Grades 11 and 12
- update knowledge on social, economic, political, cultural and other issues configured in local and global contexts; and
- develop increased capacities in social science research and education for the knowledge generation relevant to the country and the global community.

In 2016 the first batch of 11th grade students will be entering the new curriculum. This year's training is designed to help improve the social sciences and philosophy content of Grades 11 and 12 of the K-12 Program. While the theme seems to be focused primarily on the K-12 Program and therefore is of more concern to those teaching secondary education, the lectures and discussion will also impact the content of prerequisite courses at the primary level and GE courses at the tertiary level. In this context, this year's program will be equally relevant to those teaching at the primary and tertiary level.
